Pennsylvania Climate Change Act


Pennsylvania Climate Change Act (Act 70 of 2008) Requires DEP to:

- Develop a <u>climate impacts assessment</u> (3 yrs.)
- Prepare and update a <u>climate action plan</u> (3 yrs.)
- Develop an <u>inventory of greenhouse gases</u> (GHGs) (update annually)
- Administer a <u>climate change advisory committee</u> (CCAC) (bimonthly)
- Set up a voluntary registry of GHG emissions (<u>The Climate Registry</u> fulfills this requirement)



2024 GHG Inventory Report

- Data years 2005-2021
- 2021 shows a net emissions increase from 2020, as anticipated with COVID-19 recovery.
- Emissions increased across most sectors, except agriculture and waste management.
- State emissions decreased
 19.0 percent from the
 2005 baseline.







Pennsylvania's pathway to 2050

Figure 17. Sector Share of Total GHG Reductions in 2050 Achieved





LED Street Light Upgrade Locations

Estimated 1300 total City-owned street lights. Estimated 715 poles with 752 fixtures to be upgraded to LED. Estimated, of which estimated 408 are eligible for CDBG funding (Residential, LowMod, not Flood Plain). Currently, fixtures are a mix of High-Pressure Sodium Vapor, Mercury Vapor and Metal Halide.






